From Pilot to Pundit: A serious and humorous look at the Mid-east through the eyes of a fighter pilot who ended up on CNN in the Middle of the War on Terror

Major General Donald W. Shepperd, USAF (Ret.) is president of The Shepperd Group, Inc. He performs independent consulting on defense, strategic planning, executive leadership, information technology and visioning and preparation of executive teams for the 21st century. He retired in 1998 from the Pentagon as head of the Air National Guard where he oversaw preparation and execution of a \$4.2B yearly budget. He served as part of the Air Force Council and was on the Board of Directors of the Air Force Long Range Strategic Plan. He is a combat veteran who flew 247 fighter combat missions in Vietnam. General Shepperd is a military analyst for CNN and provides military commentary for ABC radio in New York and Baltimore. He has recently been seen and heard providing commentary on the military aspects of the war against terrorism in the Mid-East, Iraq and Afghanistan. He lives in Tucson, AZ, serves on several boards and was an ad hoc member of the Air Force Scientific Advisory Board. He is a graduate of the United States Air Force Academy class of 1962 and holds a Masters degree in Personnel Management.



Don Shepperd is an entertaining speaker. He talks plain, straight and simple about the vexing problems of leading people in organizations of all sizes. He has been "in the trenches," as a combat fighter pilot; a line worker; a salesman; a sales manager; a supervisor; a sector vice president; a president; and a CEO.
